So, I am going around to different city council meetings just to say hello, school board meetings. I haven't met you guys yet until now so it's nice to make it official. I have cards to give you have the meeting, but I just wanted to say hello. Introduce myself. I already know Councilman Jeff from some night at the races events and I've aready met the mayor as well just to say hello and learn more about the city. I'm just here to say hi and hear what is going on here in the City of Girard. **President of Council:** Thank you for coming. Appreciate that.

Mayor Zuppo: The addition to the agenda we would appreciate suspending the rules and passing that this evening. We consider that an emergency. Remind you of the Easter egg hunt this Saturday from 11-1 down at Tod Park ages 1-whatever. Jeff you're a little too old. There will be donuts and hot chocolate and coffee for the adults, etc. We have over 2000 eggs filled so that should be interesting. I want to point out that we did a walk through with the fire department of the Wellman Theater and with that in mind, we are going to be sending a letter to the occupants. It is unsafe for people to be having, holding church services in there at this point. I have already called them and talked to them. I've been working with the church group that meets every Wednesday. It is all of the churches in the community. They meet every Wednesday morning for breakfast. My wife goes to those meetings every Wednesday and fills me in. I have gone to one or two and they are going to try to help find those people, they are going to let them use their facilities, rotate to let them hold their services. I believe that is a really Christian move on their part. Pending your questions that concludes my report.

SAFETY/SERVICE DIRECTOR

SALVATORE PONZIO

Salvatore Ponzio: I want to start out with a public thank you to the Trumbull County Commissioners and to our fire chief for providing quick data that allowed us to get a grant from the Trumbull County Commissioners for 100% of a brand new ambulance. I want to especially thank Maura Cantalamessa who at the meeting that the chief and I attended Girard was only on a maybe list and there were some miscommunications I think with the other commissioners and so he cleared it up immediately and got us to the top of the list. Their lawyers said that we had a really good grant proposal that should provide the data for expressing the need, why we were asking for the money. So that is going to be in Jim's report and he can give more details on that, but I just wanted to let the commissioners know that we are truly grateful for their generosity. Along those lines, they also provided us with two letters of support. One for a half million dollars from Sherrod Brown and one for a half million dollars from Congressman Joyce and these are for anticipated expenses at the dam. So, we are trying to get ahead of the game here and seek appropriations from our grant writing team. So, those have already been submitted and the commissioners wrote very nice letters of support explaining how important it is to Trumbull County, especially the need for new houses that need to be built in this area according to the from Sandra O'Brien our state senator for the same project. So, we hope that we have good results with those asks too. The other thing that Mark had mentioned, we did have bid opening on March 14th for the pumpstations. We bid it all as one. There are two pumpstations that we are going to replace and A.P. O'Horo was the winning bidder and so Mark is correct and I would reiterate that I believe this is an emergency to pass it so we can get the pumps ordered and get the contractors started on those projects. That's all I have today.

COMMENTS:

Councilman Schubert: Do we have the results of the dam back yet? **Mr. Ponzio:** That's a good question. I asked today. The latest is we have the results are in but the complete analysis has not been given to Dennis Meek yet. However I think soon he is going to supply that to ODNR, they need to review it and approve it and immediately after that is done the second phase of engineering will be done that will tell us exactly what kind of spillway we need to put in, what kind of repairs to the funnel need to happen and at that time we will have a really good understanding of what the cost is going to be.

Councilman Zirafi: This money for the ambulance, is there a timeframe it has to be spent in? Is it openended? **Ponzio:** We don't spend anything. They directly pay 100% of the squad. So, we got a bid from PennCare for a complete ambulance, including all of the equipment inside. They gave us 100% of the ask so there is no match for the City of Girard. Regardless of what happens, the squad can be useful

for all of our community for emergency transportation. **Zirafi:** So you can order it and they will pay it? **Ponzio:** Yes, they are using their leftover ARP money. They gave I think four fire departments money and we were one of the ones that got 100% paid so it won't cost the City of Girard anything for a brand new ambulance.

Councilman Moliterno: My question is a follow up to what Keith asked about the dam. Do we expect to have to deal with this in 24? It has been about a year and a half of going through this now. **Ponzio:** The timeline that I saw I think had things being completed sometime in 2025. Moliterno: I don't mean complete. We may not get a response back from ODNR til the end of this year. I mean it took almost a year and a half to get the last response. **Ponzio:** I think the response when they look at the engineering study that was just done on the building of the dam, I think they will work a little quicker on that because they are the ones telling us that it is a high hazard dam. People's lives are at stake. So I hope they don't wait a year to get back to us. Moliterno: I don't either. My only point is the clock will really start running then. So it would give us some idea of when we are going to have to come up with whatever dollars we have to if we are not able to **Ponzio:** We need to get that second engineering study and that will tell us. We have ideas of what it is going to be but until we have an actual engineering study done currently. Mayor: The preliminary, the dam itself, preliminary results are good. It's the spillway. We knew that kind of ahead of the game. The other point I want to make and forgot to mention that the commissioner's meeting last week, the chief and I did attend and I stuck around through all of the antics just so I could say thank you publicly and then I went up and personally thanked, well at least two of them that would accept my thanks. The other wouldn't look at me, but they know we appreciate it and they really want to work with us. Good job Chief and Sal. Zirafi: Who pays for second engineering study? Ponzio: FEMA will give us 65%. We have to come up with the rest. I don't know what it is going to cost yet. My hope is that FEMA is going to cover 65% of all of the repairs also. That is what I have been told at this point. We are hoping to get our grant money to pay for what would be Girard's share.
